#### **Rector's Letter**

#### Dear all

#### **Blue Monday**

I'm writing this article on what has become known as 'Blue Monday' – the third Monday in January when the festivities of Christmas are well behind us, when our



inability to keep our New Year resolutions may be making us feel guilty, when we may be feeling isolated or lonely, and when the winter still seems to have a very long time to go – and all this without the ongoing impact of the pandemic and the rise in living costs which we are facing at the moment.

Now it may be that you are feeling on top of the world, or it may be that by the time you read this, Blue Monday will seem a long time ago and with Spring in the air, you may be feeling hopeful. But equally it may be that you are feeling a little down or maybe even a lot down. Now this is not the forum for in-depth advice or the offering of easy solutions, but if you are feeling 'blue', then I would simply say three things –

- to feel like this is as normal as it is to breathe! It is part of what it is to be human, and it is perfectly natural to be in different places on the spectrum of mental health that we all find ourselves on – after all, some of the great figures of the Bible all had their struggles – Moses, David, Jeremiah and Paul, to name but a few
- if you can, talk to someone you trust about how you are feeling whether that person be a friend, a family member, a priest, a doctor or maybe an appropriate professional
- share your feelings with God the bible, especially the book of Psalms, contains many examples of people telling God how they are feeling and seeking his help – consider Psalm 40 or Psalm 77, to name but two. The latter begins,

I cried out to God for help; I cried out to God to hear me. When I was in distress, I sought the Lord; at night I stretched out untiring hands, and I would not be comforted

• Sometimes the most honest and the most helpful prayer is, like the Psalmist, telling God how you are, and maybe then using one of the oldest prayers known to the church, 'Lord, Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner.' Or, if these words do not feel helpful, simply 'Lord Jesus, have mercy on me'.

#### Parish vision and finances

Changing direction rather radically, I now want to talk to you about our **'Church on Display'** fortnight that is taking place at St John's and St Luke's from 13<sup>th</sup> February. I believe we are at a very important juncture in our life as a church, not least because of the decision to make changes to the team vicar post (incidentally, interviews are scheduled for 28<sup>th</sup> April) meaning that the new post-holder will devote 50% of their time to mission, and will be seeking to plant new congregations within a few years, but also because we are facing a projected **budget deficit of £25,746** in 2022. The bottom line is that funding mission and ministry in the parish of St John's and St Luke's does not come cheap. Let me give you some facts and figures.

Our total budgeted expenditure in 2022, not including the young people's worker, is £210,000. The major elements of this are

Office expenses and salaries approx. £17,000 pa

Choir and music costs £5700

Church running costs including utility bills approx. £25,000

Buildings maintenance £24,000

Parish share - our part of diocesan costs including clergy salaries is £120,000 (we have capped this for the time being – the actual requested figure is £142,000)

Mission giving - £10,000

Meanwhile our projected income is £184,294 – so there is clearly a big gap between this and our projected expenditure.

Thus the 'Church on Display' fortnight, along with preaching and teaching on giving and vision, on the foundation that **we want to work with God for** 

*the transformation of Harrogate*, aims to inspire us to respond to these financial demands by giving us a fresh vision of what we are already doing as a church to bless and serve God and our community, and by outlining in more detail the plans for the team vicar, who will be both Team Vicar **and** Leader in Mission.

Please come into either church to look at the displays for yourselves, seeing in more detail the difference we make and hope to make – and I hope you will be inspired.

And whether or not you are able to see the displays, please be praying about your financial giving to St John's and St Luke's. The deficit of £25,746 does on the face of it seem huge, but, for example, if 100 people gave an average of £25 extra per month (the equivalent, for example, of 10 coffees, or 7 pints), that would give us an extra £30,000 per year, plus gift aid – so it is possible to turn things around – and with God, all things are possible, even in the midst of the challenging times we live in which I know are very difficult for many people.


