LETTER FROM OUR TEAM VICAR

Dear Friends,

Why is it that when the house is full of chocolate all I fancy is a sweet?

I'm writing this in May, and we seem to have lots of chocolate following Easter, and more recently my son's birthday and then my birthday. But I really don't fancy any more chocolate just now.



What I really crave is a tasty Liquorice Allsort!

However, instead of going out to buy some I thought I would talk about them instead.



Liquorice Allsorts were created in 1899 as the result of an accident (or so the story says). Charlie Thompson was a salesman at the Bassett's company. He tripped while he was carrying a tray of separate liquorice and paste candies to show a potential customer. The candies became jumbled up, creating odd combinations. The customer was impressed and placed an order for the

mixed-up candies—the first Liquorice Allsorts.

In the aftermath of Easter, the disciples were left a bit like the box of liquorice samples upended on the floor. They were a bit of a 'hotch–potch' of people – fishermen, a tax collector, a shepherd, activists and others who we know little about, each with their own colourful personalities, good and bad traits, each with their complex layers of failures and doubts just like the diverse 'allsorts' in the box. While Jesus had been alive they had stayed in reasonable order because Jesus had made it so (like the original boxes of sample sweets the salesman carried).

But when Jesus was arrested and crucified the disciples were scattered, and although after the Resurrection on Easter Day they regrouped in the upper room for a while, like the liquorice sweets being replaced in their sample box for the journey back to Bassett's, they probably felt the effects of being shaken up and were feeling 'out of sorts'.



But sometimes from what looks like chaos something wonderful begins.

The 'happy accident' of the salesman and his liquorice sweets became the well-loved box of Liquorice Allsorts that is still popular today, over 120 years later.

And the disciples?

Well, they went on to be filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (this year we celebrated in our churches on 19th May) and started the Christian Church, which shared the Good News of Jesus with all the world. The Christian Church is still sharing that Good News now, over 2000 years later, and encouraging people, whoever they are, to follow in



the way of life that Jesus demonstrated and to share God's love with the world.

Recently at the Harrogate Common Mission Forum church leaders were reminded about the importance of being confident Christians who are

courageous in sharing their faith with others. Sometimes we find this difficult. Maybe we feel that we don't have enough knowledge or experience and don't feel sure what to say. Sometimes we worry how people will react if we admit that we are Christians, and sometimes we don't want to stand out as different. But maybe,



unbeknown to us, something different is exactly what people are seeking. Maybe we don't need all that much experience, just a willingness to share our own stories of what brought us to faith and how following Jesus has made a difference to us and to the way we live.

Just like Jesus called a bunch of 'all sorts' to follow him and to build something wonderful to share God's love, God still calls all sorts of people to be part of the Church today; in their local churches, in villages, in towns and cities all over the world. He doesn't only call the 'perfect and the polished' to share the good news of his love, he calls 'all sorts' – he calls us as we are!



Whoever you are, whatever your past holds, whatever you look like, whatever age you are, whether you are an introvert or an extrovert, you are welcome in God's Church, and you have something important to share with the world because God has always used 'all sorts' of people to build his kingdom.

So, this month, how will you share your faith with someone? What part will you play in building the kingdom of God here in Bilton? What is your unique contribution to the Kingdom of God?

"Go and make disciples....and be sure of this: I am with you always." Matthew 28:19-20

They also heard about the parable


of the yeast and how a tiny bit of sourdough starter (like yeast!) is like the kingdom of

QUESTION CORNER

- Q. Should bishops mix religion and politics?
- A. Yes, sometimes. Real religion cannot avoid being concerned about how the community can best order its affairs. For Jesus said 'Love God and love your neighbour', and these cannot be separated. Love includes caring, so as

Christians we should care about people's health, housing conditions, welfare benefits etc, and seek basic justice for all.

So if the government (of any political colour) seems to be treating some people unfairly or wrongly, bishops and others should speak up about it (as long as they know what they're talking about!). Voluntary and faith-based organisations try

to fill the gaps in society's safety net, but must still insist that some of these services should be the proper responsibility of the public sector.

But this is not about narrow 'party politics', and it remains to be said that the pulpit should not be a party political platform.
