#### **CLERGY LETTER**

#### Dear friends

A somewhat poignant phrase that was sometimes used of clergy who died while still in post and who had been too poor to retire (due to the dilapidation charges on their vicarages) was that they 'died in harness'.



Fortunately, much has changed, and we are far from that position, but I am reminded of it because of the cost of living crisis that we are all going through at the moment. Even with the new measures the government is introducing, fuel and other costs are putting a lot of people under huge pressure, guite possibly some of you who are reading this letter, and so there is a great deal of anxiety and worry around. Sadly, there are no quick fix solutions, so I want to take this opportunity to remind you that it is possible both to donate to our Living Support Fund and to ask for help from this fund – just speak in confidence to one of the clergy. And we may also be able to signpost you to other sources of help such as the Harrogate Easier Living Project www.helpharrogate.org.uk/ or the Community Grocery in New Park. There are many reasons to belong to a church community, but surely one of them has to be the support we can offer one another and how together we can support people in our community - and you might be interested to know that one of the reasons why Christianity took root in the Roman Empire was because of the unique quality of care that the early Christians offered in their communities – food for thought, no pun intended.

Changing tack somewhat radically, as you will know I have recently returned from my Sabbatical which was a refreshing and renewing time, as I laid down my 'harness' for a while. Amongst the highlights were walking the Camino Ingles in Spain with my son, spending three weeks as part of the Scargill community, and some words from a person here in the parish that were more encouraging than they will ever know (which should remind us all what a gift being encouraging is). I do hope that we will all see the benefits of my time off for many months to come. And I want to take this opportunity to thank all those people who stepped up to make it possible for me to be away, whether it be the wardens, the retired clergy or Gill in the office, to name but a few. But I want to express particular thanks to Laura, who I think was quite daunted at the prospect but who I hear and see flourished under her added responsibilities and dealt admirably with all that came her way.

Anyway, I have now put the 'harness' back on, so to speak, and one of the key things facing us is the recruitment of the new team vicar and mission enabler. As I'm sure you will have heard, the second round of advertising didn't produce the right candidate, so we will be spending the next few weeks thinking and praying and seeking God's wisdom about how best we take things forward against the backdrop of the bishop's continued support for the post, wanting the best for St Luke's and to continue in our desire to play our part in growing the Kingdom of God here in Harrogate. But in all of this, please don't leave the praying to the church leadership – instead join in with us, as indeed I'm sure you have been doing already.

I began writing this letter while still at the excellent Diocesan Clergy Conference at Liverpool Hope University. I hadn't been especially looking forward to it as it seemed to come too soon after my return from sabbatical, but in some ways it turned out to be a fitting conclusion to my time off, serving as it did to remind me that we are part of something bigger – the wonderful, diverse, eccentric, life-giving body of Christ – and I hope that as I ease back into parish life, together we will continue to find the same to be true here in Bilton and beyond.

#### **QUESTION CORNER**

Q. I've always assumed that Jesus loved all his disciples. So what does John 21:7 mean? (The disciple whom Jesus loved said 'It is the Lord.')

A. This is a tricky one. The identity of 'the Beloved Disciple' has been questioned, but most agree that it is John. He and his brother James were called 'Sons of Thunder' (hot-heads) by Jesus. However, with Peter, they came to have a very close relationship with Jesus,





and he chose those three to go up the mountain with him when he revealed his divine glory ('Transfiguration').

Archbishop William Temple said that in the New Testament setting the expression 'beloved disciple' technically means something like

'complete disciple' who comes closest to and understands the master best – and one who is trusted most. When Peter and John ran to find Jesus's tomb empty they both entered, but it was John who 'saw and believed'. And in the text you quote, when Jesus appeared at the lakeside after his resurrection, it was John who first recognised him. Before that, at the crucifixion, Jesus entrusted his mother to John's future care (John 19:27). So this kind of love shows Jesus's complete trust in one who has come very close.

That's a technicality. But, as you say, Jesus loved all his disciples. Some had special roles. But were not special favourites, for all were equally loved and valued. And that's still true for disciples today.

eg felt tips, highlighters and biros


#### **Medicine Blister Packs**

#### **RACHEL'S HANDY HINTS FOR LIFE'S LITTLE EMERGENCIES**

#### Home, Office and Church

Got toner on your hands? Wash off with <u>cold</u> water as the warm water does exactly what the copier does, seals the ink onto the paper, the cold water lifts the stain.

Lost a contact lens on the carpet? Take a pop sock or part of pair of tights and cover the nozzle of the vacuum cleaner. The contact lens will stick to the nylon and not go into the vacuum cleaner to be lost forever!

*Ink stain on blouse or shirt?* Spray the stain with hairspray and leave for a few minutes depending on the size of the stain. This will lift the stain. Then wash in normal cycle.

Got a shirt to iron but not enough time? Use hair straighteners and run along the collar, cuffs and the button front. A great time saver this one and saves the faff of getting the ironing board out!

*Lily pollen on a shirt or surplice*? Pat, not rub, the stain straightaway with a bit of sellotape or parcel tape.

*Wine or blood?* Immerse the garment or table or altar cloth in cold water with a bit of salt and leave it to soak for a while. It works really well this one and as a verger it was a Godsend on many an occasion.

Dents in the carpet from a chair or table? Put an ice cube in the dent, and after it has melted and dried vacuum the area. This lifts the pile of the carpet again.

*Smelly shoes or sandals?* Sprinkle bicarbonate of soda into the shoe or on the sandal and leave for a while. The bicarb will absorb the aroma!

*Don't want to use an eyelash curler?* (This one is for us girls) Warm a teaspoon, turn it upside down and rest it on the lashes to give them the curl you want. This is kinder to the lashes too.

*Run out of furniture polish?* Use the wax from a recently lit candle. It smells nice too!

Hope these are helpful. I admit that not all of them are eco-friendly but I have used them myself.
