NEW YEAR LETTER FROM LAURA

Happy New Year to you all!

I wonder how you feel about the year that lies ahead? Sometimes on New Years Eve I feel excited about the coming year because I am expecting at least one significant thing to happen – for example having a baby, moving house, or being ordained.



Other times it feels a bit flat, there is nothing especially momentous on the horizon and January doesn't feel much different from December (except probably even colder)! Perhaps for some people, the New Year seems a bit frightening. If you have ill health, are bereaved, are looking for employment or are in financial hardship you can look at the months stretching before you with trepidation and fear.

If we look back at the Christmas story, we realise we are not alone when we look to the future with fear. Mary probably felt a lot of fear as she looked ahead to the birth of her son. First century Palestine was not the best time or place for a child to be born. Many did not survive, through illness or poverty and the risks tied up with living under occupation. Mary had good reason to fear for her tiny child, but she had additional fear to contend with. The special child she protected would not live out of harms way. He was going to get noticed, he would provoke emotion, he was going to be at risk of harm. In the Epiphany readings, which we hear in January, we are reminded that Herod was seeking to kill Jesus when he was still in his infancy. Mary was no stranger to fear.

But Mary was also very good at embracing hope and possibility. She trusted in God and responded to fear with the words "I am the Lord's servant. May your word to me be fulfilled." (Luke 1:38)

We can't see the big picture of the year ahead just yet, and we may have good reason to feel afraid. But we can reflect on the words of Mary and try to look for the hope and possibility in each new day, knowing that God (made human in Jesus) has walked this earth and journeys alongside us. Even when life is really tough, God is at still work and glimpses of glory are to be found and cherished.

In the words of Corrie Ten Boom (who saved around 800 lives during the Holocaust) "Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God."
